Biography

Tou Ger Bennett Xiong came to Minnesota as a Hmong refugee from Laos after spending four years in a refugee camp. He grew up in St. Paul, Minnesota and graduated valedictorian from Humboldt High School. He went on to receive his degree in political science from Carleton College. Today he is a nationally-known motivational speaker, diversity consultant, activist and entertainer. His work has been featured on national television, radio, and newspaper. He has presented to over 1,800

audiences in 48 states in the past 24 years. Tou Ger has been quoted as "one of the most influential Hmong in America today". A documentary/rap video of Tou Ger project entitled, " Hmong Means Free," is currently airing on television. He also starred in "Portraits From the Cloth," the first television movie about a Hmong family's journey from war. He is the recipient of the National Alumni Hall of Fame Award from the United Neighborhood Centers of America; 2014 Governor's Martin Luther King award for his work in social justice; and the 2016 Minnesota Mahatma Gandhi Award for his activism. He has appeared on America's Got Talent and in March 2019, he received the prestigious Bush Foundation Leadership Fellowship and was to continue his work in social justice. He currently resides in Woodbury, Minnesota.
